THE UNIVERSITY INTERNAL RESEARCH FUND Call for Research Proposals for Early Career Researchers Fund 2017/2018

Background

The mission of Kisii University is to train high level human resource that meets the development needs of the country and international labour market, and to sustain production of high quality research and consultancy, and dissemination of skills and competences for the advancement of humanity. In order to realize this mission, the university academic staff must be actively involved in research. To support this endeavour, the University is initiating the Early Career Researchers Fund for researchers within five years of their award of their doctoral degrees. The Early Career Researchers Fund is meant to support research activities that would enhance the growth of early career researchers together with their mentors. It is anticipated that this would form a starting point for researchers to contribute to increased knowledge pool resulting from increased University led research and an increased publication to increase a greater visibility of the University in the development agenda. Success in research that has significant impact on society and produces economic growth comes from collaborative cross-disciplinary ventures. To enable such ventures, early career researchers must show evidence of continued research collaboration with their mentors.

The Early Career Research fund would enable recent Doctoral graduates to jump start their research career by giving them opportunities to partner with their mentors to conduct ground breaking research in areas of mutual benefit to the University but related to the applicants Doctoral studies. Topics should be related to the SDGs and vision 2030, with a special emphasis on South-West Kenya. As of necessity, the researcher should demonstrate on-going collaboration with a mentor. Further, a training component for undergraduate and master's students should be included in the proposal. This is key to ensure that as early career researchers are supported by their mentors, they are also supporting their students, this way; the research fund will have a multiplier effect that is necessary to grow the research capacity of the University. The key objective of the internally funded research calls for proposals is to enhance the research capacity for implementing an innovation systems approach to find solutions to problems facing South-West Kenya. And as part of that objective, the University also seeks to empower earlier career researchers to hone their research skills. To be considered for funding, research proposals are expected to be robust, original, innovative, meet eligibility requirements and be in line with the University's strategic plan 2009-2019.

Eligibility

- ✓ The proposal must fall into the theme of the call and be in line with the University's strategic plan 2009-2019.
- ✓ Applicant is eligible to make only one application as a lead applicant
- ✓ Applicant must have obtained their PhDs within the last five years; those who have successfully defended their PhD theses will also be considered.
- ✓ Applicant must have relevant qualification and experience in the subject area of the proposed project
- ✓ Applicant must produce letter of support from their mentor indicating their willingness to support applicant to conduct this research study.

Proposal Format**Content and Form of the Proposal Submission**

The proposal should include a **statement of objectives**, a mentor and their institution and a list of students to be mentored within the research proposal. An indication on how the research proposal, if funded will support the relevant faculty in building a robust research culture. Each proposal should include the following components as a minimum:

The proposal should include:-

- 1) Title Page
 - Title Page One - including project title, author and **collaborator(s)** their research institute, designations and discipline of study.
 - Abstract
- 2) Introduction
 - Background to the problem
 - Statement of the problem.
 - Justification
 - Objectives
 - Hypothesis / research questions
- 3) Literature Review
- 4) Materials and Methods/Research Methodology
- 5) Expected output
- 6) Work Plan
- 7) Budget
- 8) References
- 9) Appendices should include:-
 - ✓ Applicant's brief curriculum vitae (one page)
 - ✓ 1 page of the research path proposed by the applicant.
 - ✓ Mentors Letter of support

Budget –A justification for each line item requested for funding should be provided.

Maximum Funding Level	All proposals will undergo a blind peer review process and successful research projects shall be funded up to a maximum of KES. 1,000,000 .

Soft copies should be sent as word documents while two hard copies should be double spaced, times new roman, font 12, spiral bound, and not exceeding 30 pages.</p>
